End to end pathways

- PSA Autumn Series great to see some Australians coming over for the Panmure Open and Auckland Open for some much needed competition against kiwi home-grown talent.
- There is one final PSA 50% prizemoney event available to host before the end of July. There is an interested club Shelley is speaking with at the moment.
- District Development Framework draft is attached for feedback. The group will re-connect to finalise the framework before the end of the month.
- Shelley has been working in partnership with the Henderson Squash Club in the
 development of a junior pathway model. It gives new players and parents a clear pathway to
 follow, which will assist in the retention of junior squash players. John Fletcher provided

Grassroots Initiatives

• A new initiative that will help grassroots organisations fundraise for the things they need is being launched soon. At the height of COVID-19 last year, it became clear there was a need to help sector organisations become more financially resilient. Sport NZ looked overseas and to other industries for new ways to help. Through this came the idea of a digital solution to enable community philanthropy and fundraising. Sport NZ and the New Zealand Sports Foundation Charitable Trust have now teamed up with the Arts Foundation Te Tumu Toi to launch BoostedSport. It's a crowdfunding platform that will allow organisations in sport and recreation to fundraise for community projects. Over the next month, the BoostedSport website is being tested to ensure it runs smoothly. During the trial, other organisations and projects can't use the site for fundraising but can register their interest for the next phase. We'll be in touch again in due course once the testing is complete. The next phase will include education and learning about how the new fundraising platform works and how it can help community organisations. Increased commercial Opportunities

- Ball Orders:_We had a great response to ball orders this time around. We are pleased that all of the balls can be delivered, however the majority will be in blister 3 packs rather than dozens. If you haven't received by the end of next week please let us know. Remember we are able to supply balls to clubs for their organised play and competitions, they are not to be resold to members or be part of a Pro Shop.
- Sharp: Release attached that will be promoted on the boast. I will be sending to district administrators the details of the offer for photocopier to clubs. It is up to the district to identify and discuss opportunity with the club and then report back via one channel. Details will be included.
- Racketball. We will be piloting an offer to only a couple of districts due to product supply shortly (we will start with Waikato due to high interest). We will look to nationally roll out in July-August when supplies will be high.
- Club Kitchen use, named Club Grub: We have two districts (BOP and Eastern) that have nominated clubs which we will use as a pilot. Very exciting venture and we will put this offer on hold until the pilot has begun.
