From Justines iPad Pro 9.7 : hello booking email out tonight says can scan QR code and complete check in on own device to avoid touching public computer

From Jo Noonan : Is anyone dealing with multi sport eg. tennis and squash for bookings and contact tracing.

From Debbie Clarke : we're tennis and squash too, with no computer systems yet. just thinking about physical pen pad register and just have to trust our members

From Debbie Clarke : guess bar and kitchens opening will depend on what government say?

From Bryan Powlesland : Is squash NZ putting out communication on Thursday night re level 2 clarity

From Jo Noonan : Can we get a generic poster from Squash NZ on court etiquette eg. no slapping sweaty hands on the walls or floor; wiping up your sweat as you play and after using your own towel, etc

From Grant Lewis - Christchurch SC : Most discussion on what we should or shouldn't do in our clubs is mute until we get specific guidelines for Level 2 to consider and act on.

From Debbie Clarke : we have 1 gate and 1 door that gets us into both tennis and squash courts. yes any help be great :)

From dominique : A poster with squash etiquette would be great

From Myles's iPad : this could be an option for those without computer etc simpletrace.nz app designed by a Wellington company.

From Wayne Peterson : Cambridge Racquets Club is open for tennis under L3.

From Grant Lewis - Christchurch SC : I think you will find that you can put together a good plan pretty quickly. If we find out what Level 2 looks like by the end of the week and it is likely that Level 2 begins Thursday week then that should be sufficient time.

From Paul Cornish : Don't ever wipe hands on walls!!

From Debbie Clarke : our club too small to have a staff member

From Grant Lewis - Christchurch SC : If you are not ready to open on the day Level 2 starts don't feel pressured to open. Take your time. Start small if necessary and see how it goes.

From Debbie Clarke : we do want our members motivation to stay up to play and stay with our sport

From dominique : Who would enforce these rules and check that all members adhere to them? How "responsible" is each club?

From Grant Lewis - Christchurch SC : Reasonable measures should be taken but there is an element of trust and honesty involved. Clubs don't have to act like policeman.

From Simon.Clearwater : Clubs with gyms are you planning on opening these during level 2?

From Debbie Clarke : unfortunately health and safety act i think comes to play in regards to club responsibilities if their members. it's if we're investigated, making sure our processes are documented

From dominique : Thank you

From Jason Van Lierop Cromwell squash club : Has anyone thought about future club nights with more players in the club for the contact tracing.

From Geordie Wilson : we are not anticipating being able to operate club nights under level 2

From Debbie Clarke : yes! great thought...no cash and paywave

From Geordie Wilson : club nights had been open to all - if we do operate it would have to think about managing numbers and contact tracing requirements

From Paul Cornish : Club night involves considerable extra risk, simpler not to open especially for smaller clubs without bar staff.
